

Six-Time National Combined Driving Champion Claims Victory at Garden State CDE

Allentown, NJ- The rain was no match for the nearly invincible Chester Weber and his Four-in-Hand team. Weber made it six consecutive victories in a row with the win last week at the Garden State CDE. Along with his sixth win in a row, Weber made history in March of this year when he collected his sixth consecutive USEF Four-In-Hand National Championship title. The Ocala, Florida based driver traveled to Allentown, New Jersey for his most recent victory.

The Garden State CDE was part of the USEF Selection Trials for the 2008 World Horse Championships. Weber won this phase for the Selection Trials, as well as the two previous, making him a clear choice to represent the United States this September at the World Horse Championships to be held in Beesd, Netherlands. In addition to participating as an exhibitor at the Garden State CDE, Weber has formerly been a member of the ground jury twice.

Without much time to rest after his victory, Weber is now traveling to Europe. In July, he plans to compete at prestigious competitions in Aachen and Riesenbeck, Germany. These competitions will help him ensure his horses are in top shape before presenting them in the World Horse Championships. Previously, Weber has had a great deal of success competing in Europe. In 2004, he became the first American to win the German Fahrderby held at CAI Riesenbeck. He has also helped the United States Driving Team win a silver medal at the FEI World Equestrian Games, the highest placing ever from a U.S. team.
