

# Chester Weber Once Again Shows Off World Class Combined Driving During Demonstration At The Washington International Horse Show

Washington, D.C. (November 9, 2011) – Combined Driver Chester Weber has thrilled audiences with driving demonstrations at the Washington International Horse Show for the past two years, and the eight-time USEF National Four-In-Hand Champion didn't disappoint the thousands of spectators on hand for the prestigious show this year. Weber and his team of horses gave the Washington International Horse Show crowd a world-class demonstration that introduced them to each phase of the challenging sport of combined driving.



Weber is known for being a highly competitive driver who sets goals and accomplishes them, and he brought that winning attitude to Washington. “I always enjoy giving a demonstration at Washington International. Just like in previous years, the crowd this year was enthusiastic and really seemed to enjoy seeing Team Weber in action,” Weber said. “During the demonstration I introduced the Washington audience to the sport of combined driving through demonstrating the three days of competition while describing to the audience what I was doing.”

Considered one of the biggest promoters of combined driving, Weber explained and demonstrated the dressage, marathon and cones phases during the demonstration. “Combined driving is my passion and I love to share it with others,” Weber said. “I especially love it when I get to introduce new people to the sport.”

Weber, who helped the U.S. Combined Driving team clinch the Silver Medal at the 2010 World Equestrian Games, spent the summer of 2011 on a successful European tour. With the addition of two new horses to his superstar team, Splash and Uniek owned by Jane Clark, Weber proved to be an unstoppable force in Europe putting in a brilliant performance at the CHIO Aachen and winning at CAIO Vecses, CAI Altenfelden, and CAI Riesenbeck.

As America's most highly decorated combined driver, Weber recently donated a sterling silver trophy to the winner of the USEF National Championship Combined Driving Single Horse. Entitled the “Jamaica Perpetual Trophy,” the trophy honors Weber's legendary equine partner Jamaica who was named the 2008 USEF Horse of the Year. “I am excited about the Jamaica Perpetual Trophy because it is another way to recognize and support the sport of combined driving,” Weber said.
